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Susan M. Brookhart is an independent educational consultant based in Helena, Mont. She is an ASCD Faculty member and a senior research associate in the School of Education at Duquesne University. Before becoming a consultant, she was professor and chair of the Department of Educational Foundations and Leadership at Duquesne University and was an elementary and middle school classroom teacher. Brookhart has spent the last 20 years studying and writing about classroom assessment practices and is internationally known as a scholar in this field. She specializes in combining research-based strategies and practical applications, working with classroom teachers and school administrators to customize strategies for their locations.

Purpose of this Professional Learning Experience:

Effective feedback gives students information they can use to further their learning. Effective feedback "feeds students forward" in the formative learning cycle, and that can only happen if students are clear about the learning target they are aiming for. Effective feedback supports student motivation and self-regulation of learning, as well. Feedback can come from teachers or peers or from the students themselves. Students should be involved in all of these types of feedback, even when the feedback comes from the teacher.

Specific Learning Outcomes:

This workshop will focus on Formative Assessment, paying specific attention to:

- Define feedback and explain why feedback with student involvement is important for learning
- Develop a repertoire of teacher, self, and peer feedback strategies that involve students
- Recognize the characteristics of effective feedback in both oral and written feedback examples
- Differentiate feedback for different learners
