Purpose

This session will provide an expanded version of the Curriculum Leaders Institute session on assessment. It will provide attendees with information and ideas that they can use to consider how to focus and streamline student assessment in their districts and schools, using the types of assessment that will promote student learning and achievement.

Outcomes

Specific learning outcomes include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Create an inventory of local district or school assessments, rating each on several dimensions
- Have a fundamental understanding of the keys to quality assessments, different information needs of different individuals, multiple types of assessment are needed to meet the information needs, and understand the different types of assessment used should be coordinated with one another and serve to provide balance to the overall assessment program
- Create an assessment design/re-design process for their school or district, including the steps to operationalize the plan in their school or district
- Know the types of assessment literacy standards needed by students, educators, and policymakers
- Understand their own assessment literacy needs, and that of school staff and school and district leaders
- Create an assessment literacy development plan for themselves and others they work with
